Trees bring hope

Creation care for global justice

³¹ He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. ³² Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches." **Matthew 13.31-32**

The tiniest seed releases great promise, and the tree provides life-changing shelter, refuge and life. As we take environmental action, big or small, the Kingdom of Heaven is ushered in.

In Malawi, the Baobab tree is changing people's lives.

Many there are struggling in the face of the climate crisis. Extreme weather is affecting crops; cyclones have destroyed homes, floods have washed away livestock.

The climate crisis is pushing women like Janet Ben deeper into poverty. Janet (right) gestures to a pile of muddy bricks, all that's left of her old house after Cyclone Idai swept through Malawi in March 2019. Her family lost everything.



Christian Aid Ireland holds a vision of a better world, free from poverty and climate change. Where everyone has enough to eat, and can live without fear of their home and land being destroyed.

But right now, millions of the world's poorest people are feeling the worst impacts of climate change, and experts predict more floods, drought and extreme weather patterns to come. For those living in poverty, this means more hunger, conflict and insecurity, and a more uncertain future.



Hope came to Janet from the massive baobab trees near her home. Janet points out the fruit, high up in the branches, that has made all the difference to Janet and her friends in the Makande Women's Group.

With the profits from the business, Janet has been able to build a new home; the income gives her and her family resilience against the climate crisis.
