Learning Objective 1: The Revelation of God (God and the Bible)

Pupils should begin to develop an awareness, knowledge, understanding and appreciation of the key Christian teachings about God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) about Jesus Christ and about the Bible and begin to develop an ability to interpret and relate the Bible to life.

Prayer:	Noah obeyed and loved God. Help me to obey and love God too. Amen
Suggestions for parents:	Religious Education enables the child to develop spiritual and moral values and come to a knowledge of God. A. The Story of Noah (Genesis 6-8)



Once there was a man called Noah...








DO YOU SEE THE ANIMALS

To the tune of "Muffin Man".




Oh do you see the animals

D. DRAMA / ROLE-PLAY

ACTIVITY: DRAMATISE THE STORY OF NOAH

"Bring two of every living thing into the ark." Genesis 6:19

Ask the children to do the following hand motions and to repeat the words after you, to help them dramatise the story of Noah and learn the Bible Verse:

Bring: hold both arms out and them bring them into the body

two: hold two fingers up

of every living thing: breath in deeply

into: hold one hand in a circle and put the other hand into it

the ark: hold hands together, in the shape of a boat, and move forward through the water


Genesis 6: hold six fingers up

19: hold ten fingers up and then hold nine fingers up

Do this a few times with the children. Make it fun for them to do the motions and say the words.

Use some of these free images and pictures to create a poster, display or collage for your classroom









F. CIRCLE WORK



Gather the children in a circle.
Talk about the story of Noah and the Ark.

Talk about the rainbow and what it represents (God's promise to never again flood the world)

Talk about how long 40 days and 40 nights is. Count to 40 with the children.

God promised to look after Noah and the animals. What is a promise? Have you ever made a promise?

Name the different animals that Noah would have brought with him. Play a CD of animal sounds or describe them and see if the children can identify them.

Make an ark together and draw in the various animals or help the children individually to make their own ark using paper plates and insert the various animals.

Make up a prayer together expressing thanks for God's care and providence.
