Ministry of Jesus/Story of Zacchaeus Lesson Plan

Core Concept of Lesson: Everyone needs a friend, to feel included and welcomed. Jesus welcomed Zacchaeus and showed him friendship. Jesus expects us to be friendly and welcoming to others. Understanding our own and the feelings of others can help us to be better friends.

Learning Intentions: This lesson provides children with the opportunity to familiarise themselves with a story depicting the ministry of Jesus and to practise understanding and expressing a variety of emotions and feelings. The additional activities encourage children to experience the core concept of friendship through play, art, music, verbal expression, sequencing, cooperation and affirmation.

Lesson Plan Details

Ministry of Jesus/Story of Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-10)

Stage	Aim/Purpose	Time	Procedure	Resources/ Materials
Warming up	 encourage children to think about 'friendship' 	5 min.	 Ask the following (or similar) questions: Who can tell me the name of his/her best friend? What are some things you like to do with your friends? Why do you think everyone needs a friend? 	
Introduction	 to prepare the children to learn about the ministry of Jesus by hearing the story of Zacchaeus to introduce (or reinforce) vocabulary To continue to familiarise the children with the Bible/New Testament 	5 min.	 Ask the following questions, guiding the answers: Can anyone tell me what the word 'Gospel' means? 'Gospel'—part of the Bible that tells us about Jesus and the things he said and did, and that the word means 'good news'. Does anyone know how many Gospels there are in the Bible? Explain: Our story today comes from one of the Gospels, the Gospel of Luke. Show: A Bible, New Testament, Gospel of Luke, Chapter 19 	Bible

Activity 1: Participative Storytelling	 To familiarise the children with a story about the ministry of Jesus To encourage the children to think about Jesus and look at the world from the perspective of someone else (Zacchaeus) To encourage the children to demonstrate their understanding of a variety of emotions and feelings To encourage children to think creatively, logically, personally 	15 min.	Explain: Today we're going to hear a story about someone who once had Jesus come to his house as his guest. This man was named Zacchaeus. I'm going to need you to help me tell the story, by showing what Zacchaeus was feeling all along the way. So, as I tell the story, I will stop and ask you to show me a feeling or an emotion. Practise: Let's have a practice: 'Zacchaeus was so excited to see Jesus.' Show me 'excited.' Tell/Read the story 'Jesus is Coming', pausing at 'emotion' words (bold/italicized) and encouraging the children to act out the particular emotion or feeling. Ask some follow-up questions: What do you think happened next? Do you Zacchaeus did what he'd promised Jesus? Do you think Zacchaeus understood friendship better after meeting Jesus? How does it make you feel when you hear that Jesus wants to be our friend, just like he wanted to be Zacchaeus' friend?	"Jesus is Coming!" (PDF)
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Activity 2: Friendship Game (or alternative)	 To let the children practise being friendly/welcoming to others, encouraging positive relationships with others To encourage inclusive and creative play To help the children learn to recognise and manage their own feelings and consider the feelings of others 	15 min.	Introduce: We're going to play a game that lets us be friendly and welcoming to others. Explain: We'll sit in a circle and I'll start. I'll choose someone in the circle and gently toss the bean bag to her/him. I'll say hello and that child's name, and then I'll tell him/her something that I like about him/her. For example: 'Hello, Kayleigh. I like the way you smile at people when they come into the classroom.' 'Hello, James. I like the way you make sure everyone has a turn when it's time for games.' Play: Until every child has had a chance to affirm and to be affirmed by at least one other person. Ask the following or similar questions: How does it make you feel when someone says something good about you? Did you find it easy or difficult to say something nice about another person? How does it make you feel when someone says something mean to you? When might someone need you to be extra friendly?	Small beanbag

Explain: On this page, you'll see six different scenes from the story of Jesus and Zacchaeus, but they are out of order. After you colour in the pictures, you will cut them out and then try to put them in order. When everyone is finished, we will tell the story using these pictures.
