This Diocese of Armagh Board of Religious Education Lesson Plan 2 (The Life of Jesus) has been designed to link specifically to the following:

Pupils should begin to develop an awareness, knowledge, understanding and appreciation of the key Christian teachings about God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) about Jesus Christ and about the Bible; and begin to develop an ability to interpret and relate the Bible to life.

Prayer:	Dear Lord, thank you for the gift of Jesus. Amen
Suggestions for parents:	Religious Education enables the child to develop spiritual and moral values and come to a knowledge of God. The teacher aims to work in partnership with parents to continue in school much of what is being done at home. By taking an interest in the worksheets or pictures they bring home, parents will be playing an important part in their child's faith development. They will help them to grow in faith, in knowledge of God and in love of God's word.

A. Reading a Story

The Story of Christmas

About 2000 years ago when King Herod ruled Judea (part of Israel), God sent the angel Gabriel to visit Mary. She was engaged to Joseph and lived in Nazareth. The angel said to Mary "Peace be with you. God has blessed you". Mary was surprised and the angel said "Be not afraid. You will be blessed by the Holy Spirit and give birth to a baby boy and you will call him Jesus. He will be God's only son. Mary was afraid but trusted God. "Let it happen as God chooses", she replied to the angel Gabriel. He told her that her cousin Elizabeth would also have a baby boy whom God had chosen to prepare the way for Jesus.

Mary then went to visit her cousin Elizabeth and her husband Zechariah. An angel had already told them that their baby would prepare people to welcome Jesus. He was to be called John. Mary stayed with Elizabeth for three months and then went home to Nazareth.

An angel appeared to Joseph in a dream and told him not to be afraid and that Mary had been chosen by God as the mother of his son and he would be named Jesus, which meant 'Saviour'. He went ahead and took Mary as his wife.

At that time the Roman Emperor Augustus wanted everyone in the Empire to pay their taxes. He ordered everyone to go to their home towns and register for a census. They travelled a long way from Nazareth to Bethlehem where Joseph's family came from. They had problems finding somewhere to stay as every house was full and every bed was taken in all the Inns. The only shelter was a stable and this is where Mary gave birth to Jesus, the Son of God. She wrapped him in cloth called swaddling clothes and laid him in the manger, where the animals ate their food from.

The shepherds were in the fields outside Bethlehem watching their sheep when an angel appeared and said "I have good news. Today a Saviour has been born and you will find him lying in a manger". They saw more angels who were singing "Glory to God in the highest and peace to everyone on earth". The shepherds went to Bethlehem and told everyone the good news and praised God.

A bright star appeared in the sky and some Wise Men in faraway countries saw this and knew there was a new King born. They followed the star bringing gifts. Herod, the King of Judea heard this and he was angry that there was somebody that would take his place. He sent for the Three Wise Men and told them to follow the Star and tell him where the baby was. He planned to kill the new king but they did not know this.

When the Wise Men entered the house where Jesus was with Mary, they bowed down and worshipped him. They gave him the gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. They were warned in a dream by God not to go back to Herod so they went home a different way.

Then an angel appeared to Joseph and warned him to take Jesus and Mary and escape to Egypt and to escape from Herod and he did just that. When Herod realized he had been tricked he was furious and ordered that all the boys of two or younger in Bethlehem and around be killed. After Herod had died, Joseph had another message from an angel in a dream who told them to go back to Israel. But when they heard that Herod's son was now King of Judea they were afraid and instead went to Galilee and lived in their old town of Nazareth.




Using safe scissors, cut out these nativity characters. Use glue to stick them on to cardboard and create your own special Christmas crib.
